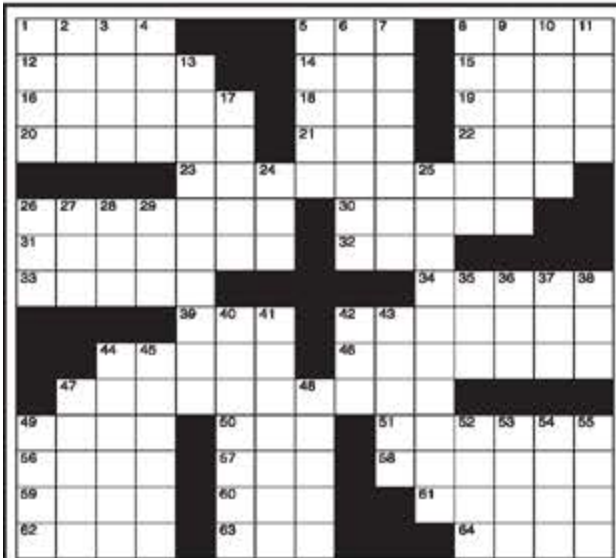

I got to Moab in 1968, graduated from Grand County High School in 1986. My family has been here much longer than that. We have always loved this little valley in Utah, even when few others did or could. It has been, it is and will always be my home town.

Aside from a few obituaries, this is my first submission of a letter to the editor. It is against my nature and my better instincts to get overly involved with politics in this town. I am not tribal and reluctantly choose sides. I typically like everybody I meet, appreciating their individual perspectives and ideas. I love our farmers, artists, cowboys, teachers, doctors, dancers, rednecks, Latinos..... (you get the point). I consider the fact that because we choose to live in this valley, that we have common ground, literally and figuratively. However, in the race for mayor I have chosen a side. Along with my entire family, we will be supporting Joette Langianese for a whole host of personal and public reasons. I won't bore you with details here.

But, I would like to comment on one of the broader campaign messages and to address the notion of the big Changes being proposed. It always sounds good and looks good on a billboard. But without impeccable leadership, a comprehensive plan and a bullet proof strategy, large scale change can

quickly turn into chaos and dysfunction. And it is the people in the community, caught in the middle, that lose the most. Change can happen and happen in a positive way if the right things are in place. I see neither the leadership nor the plan in place to execute change on the scale that is being proposed. Mind you, efficiency, it is my motto. I live by the rule to be 'lean and mean'. I believe we should get every ounce of productivity from the taxpayer's money. And that the government should not overburden the public with complicated process. Those are sensible goals that I think everyone can agree on.

The main question is; what will it be like in the transition period to consolidate government and make the big changes?..... Who will be in charge? Who will be patrolling the streets? Who will be cleaning the storm drains? What about the duties that loyal public servants are quietly doing for us every day? Will it be the folks that are losing their jobs or those that are now expected to learn a new job that will be taking care of our town? Many of the people working in and with our government have contracts. Who has to foot the bill for the attorneys? As you know, they will be the big winners in the big change. Who pays for that?..... We do. We will pay in frustration and then tax dollars. And rather than focusing resources on things that can benefit the community, the courts and lawyers will bog down our town to a standstill. Wasted time, energy and money and then, more than likely, ending up right back with a very similar, if not exact, 2 tiered form of government. If you feel like it's complicated now to get things done and that it is too expensive. Wait until the lawyers sink their teeth in.

It is a frustrating fact that it can be too hard, too expensive and too complicated to get things done within our government. It's harder and more expensive than it should be all too often and they owe us to do better, especially when they can. We do need a better feedback loop from government to the citizens and efficiency should be their motto.

Keep in mind that it is always easy to criticize and place blame on those that are currently in charge. But many of the

things Joette is getting negative credit for was already policy or existing statute and the projects that have taken place were already in the pipeline before she took office. I encourage people to do their homework. The question now is how do we move forward? Can we get proper, legal and productive change working within the system we have? I think we can. It does take motivated leadership, honest leadership and genuinely concerned leadership. It takes people who are listening to the people and care about the people in the community. I believe Joette when she says she is listening; she has listened to me. And I believe her when she says that she cares, she always has. And I have to believe her when she says she would like to make things better for all of us. She needs to honor the reforms that can benefit the hardworking people who live here, starting with being cost effective and efficient. She says she has good momentum and a good team with the heart of the community in mind and in the next 4 years she can prove it. I am willing to give her that chance.

I urge people to vote with their conscience, their heart and their minds. That is what I used to put my support behind Joette.

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Reasons I'm Supporting Curtis Wells for Mayor

Since coming to Moab 35 years ago, I've seen and been part of the change to the community. In 1990 when I moved here, the town was half boarded up. People couldn't sell a house by the park for even \$35,000. Jobs were in short supply, schools were only open 4 days a week and the economy was in the toilet. Some folks still refer to those as the 'good old days' and I understand it was quiet.

I saw Grand County as an area of opportunity. As the county has evolved, I've often wondered why do we have two (2) sets of government for such a small area and small population. And over the years I wonder more why we haven't rebelled as citizens against supporting 2 sets of everything governmental. Not too long ago the city government was small, occupying a few offices just west of Walker Tru Value on 200 South. When the new high school was built at the site of the old junior high; then the old jr. high became the Moab City government complex, more offices were added and expanded, seems everyone got a secretary or assistant, fancier offices and many more people hired. But the service to the taxpayer went downhill. Awkward boundaries of the city and county created months of wasted time going thru the annexation process as one side of the lane is in the city and one side is in the county. Our population in the city and county is still about the same with 125 or so seniors still graduating from Grand County High School. The budget has more than doubled in the past few years.

My point is that as taxpayers you're paying way too much for government and the city government is probably not necessary at all. We've had numerous tax hikes lately and another two are on the way. I say NO! It's time to combine some services, cut the fat out of the budgets and economize. I'd hope to see some candidates that want to help stop this abuse and Curtis has told me he'll start working toward that.

Time to Respect the Taxpayers!

1- IN MY OPINION, A DISHONEST & UNNECESSARY TAX INCREASE CRAFTED AND SUPPORTED BY MAYOR LANGIANESE

Just one year ago the mayor with the support of the council crafted a plan to implement a new property tax, EVEN though a similar tax had been voted down by the City Council 2 years earlier. The Mayor's taskforce conducted workshops and meetings designed "or so we thought" to get voter input and ideas.

Those meetings and workshops were, IN MY OPINION, BALONEY. The Mayor and Council had already made up their mind to vote for the tax. At the public hearing a vast majority of those in attendance, voiced a loud NO to the tax. Citizens were given very little time to talk while the Council and Mayor talked at length with what appeared to be no restraint. At the conclusion of the meeting the Council and Mayor did not even take the public comments under advisement for a week or two, but rather voted right then to implement the tax. It looked like public comment did not matter. It also seemed to me the Mayor and the Council thought we, the voters, were too stupid to make our own decisions. We're just sheep to be sheared for their agenda. It was also suspect that the City chose an off-election year for the scam, at the end of summer when most people are busy with family stuff. It seemed like they didn't want to face voters with this issue. The tax should be rolled back and then put to a vote to see if the citizens think it's necessary.

2- COMPLETE BUNGLING OF THE WALNUT LANE TRAILER PARK COMMUNITY --FAILED THE TAXPAYERS, IN MY OPINION

Four (4) years ago Mayor Langianese and Council inherited what I view as a very poorly planned low income housing project. The previous administration had, in my opinion, grossly over paid for the property and used what is, to me, the crazy excuse that if they didn't buy it someone else would turn it into overnight lodging. What -- overnight lodging on Walnut Lane? That's improbable because it wasn't zoned as commercial. Langianese and Council should have recognized the fallacy of the project. In my view the mess is clearly out of city compliances. Instead our current leaders have spent hundreds of thousands of tax dollars, thousands of hours of paid advisors, thousands of hours of city paid time and in the end they tore the trailers down and evicted the last of the families. The property now sits vacant, partially torn down, a dozen trailers standing boarded-up in total disrepair, sky high piles of trash and litter everywhere. It looks worse than a ghetto, more like a battleground in Gaza. And to make it worse, families are trying to live in their homes next door. If a private business person left a filthy mess like this, they'd rightfully be villainized by the press and sued by the government. **Where is the Press?** In my opinion, the leadership of Moab City has demonstrated that they are completely incompetent to manage even the smallest of projects. Based on my experience, it would take \$4,000,000 or so to break even. Again, they don't care about taxpayers' money. I invite you to go see the mess for yourself.

3- IN MY OPINION, LITTLE ATTEMPT BY LANGIANESE OR CITY COUNCIL TO WORK WITH THE COUNTY TO MODERNIZE AND COMBINE SOME OBVIOUS DEPARTMENTS

This could save millions in taxpayer money.

Law enforcement, planning & zoning, roads maintenance, attorneys--every department has room for efficiencies. We are a community of 9,000 supporting two (2) sets of everything. Stupid money management, we need HELP. We need new common sense, taxpayer sensitive, transparent leadership.

4- IN MY VIEW THE BUDGET HAS BALLOONED UNDER LANGIANESE & CITY COUNCIL, IS VERY UNTRANSPARENT AND THE SERVICE HAS GOTTEN WORSE

From what I see, thousands of dollars are now budgeted for a lobbyist to help the City get control of the old tailings site that is clearly in the County.

A full time P.R. person on the payroll to carefully let the public know just the things they want out.

I don't think the toilets haven't worked at the Old City Park all summer.

Fancier offices, new assistants and raises for those at the top.

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5- CITY PARKING AND "SO CALLED STREET IMPROVEMENTS" HAVE RESULTED IN BOTTLE NECKS, LOSS OF PARKING

And again piled on PUBLIC DEBT, in my opinion. The Kane Creek boulevard to nowhere now has up to 8' sidewalks, that hardly anyone uses, generous bike lanes, thousands of new plants and fancy lights but with the loss of maybe 50 parking spots.

The boulevard connects to nothing, unless it's meant to be the gateway for the Kane Creek Luxury Homes.

But the project leaves the City owing an estimate of \$4,200,000 that has to be paid off

plus monthly maintenance of all the fancy landscaping.

Downtown parking is problematic. Center Street is a nightmare for City businesses. We could of had a 250-stall parking garage instead.

6- THE FLOODS LAST YEAR CAUSED A LOT OF DAMAGE, COST TENS OF THOUSANDS AND SHOULD BE A WAKE UP CALL TO GET READY AGAIN.

It seems to me that the City leadership has endorsed the current plan that moved some dirt around, hauled in pretty white rocks but hasn't significantly enlarged the channel, cleaned out debris or removed barriers that caused the floods to be so disastrous.

Meanwhile the flood mitigation seems, incomplete & bogged down.

7- LITTLE INTEREST IN HELPING DOWNTOWN ECONOMY, IN MY VIEW.

The economies of downtown Moab have been declining in the years since Langianese was elected Mayor.

The town is experiencing the slowest summer in recent years and the decline is becoming the "new normal".

Meanwhile the city businesses collect and give to the city millions in sales tax, TRT taxes, and resort taxes.

It seems to me the City does little, if anything, to help the businesses and they don't care about helping.

In fact, I'm not sure they know how. Seems to me they just want the money. Shear the sheep!

Langianese and Council have failed the business community big time!!!

8- IN MY VIEW THE CITY GOVERNMENT HAS ASSUMED AN ATTITUDE OF ENTITLEMENT AND NO LONGER CONSIDERS THEMSELVES PUBLIC SERVANTS.

The City building closes at noon on Friday and, in what I've seen, they don't get much done so it's really a 4 day week for them.

In fact it doesn't seem to me they work with any sort of urgency or even helpfulness anymore.

I've had 4 projects that have required City help in the past 3 years and they have all been made too hard by the City.

1) I built an 85 bed employee housing complex without the aid of any government money.

It was just what I needed for my crew and exactly what everyone's always complaining we need.

My experience with the City planning, engineering and staff was negative, slow and never encouraging.

I turned an ugly building in a junk-covered lot paying a couple thousand in property tax into an 85 bed multiple use employee project that now pays a whopping \$24,700 in property tax.

I DON'T RECOMMEND ANYONE BUILD EMPLOYEE HOUSING IN THE CITY. IT'S JUST TOO HARD AND TOO EXPENSIVE.

2) I was helping the Sego Lily Garden and preschool with their irrigation problems this spring and in the course of the help I found out the City's drain ditch went thru the Sego Lily property was silted in, clogged with trees and a hazard for the children that play near it. Since I had my equipment and crew already there, I volunteered to fix it. I could have fixed it in 2 days for FREE, but the director of the Sego Lily wanted to ask the City. An engineer came down to the site with a maintenance guy. They proceeded to tell me how problematic it was going to be. That we needed easements and engineering and I better not do it. They promised to get back to me in 2 weeks. That was March, and I haven't heard a word, meanwhile the City came over and put up a flimsy fence that's been torn down by the wild animals. Also interesting that the big culverts to fix the drainage have been sitting next to the project for 3 years or so, while the ditch is an open mosquito breeding ground. Terrible, uncaring, incompetent city government.

3) I'm helping the National Ability Center, a group that helps special needs folks have outdoor experiences like rafting. I've been a supporter for over 35 years and we've dreamed of having a lodge type building as a headquarters. We finally got the adjacent property we needed but when we got started with planning, we found part was in the city, part in the county. While the City helped with the annexation process, it has taken a year to do something so simple. If the county and city were one entity this would not be such a problem.

4) I have a piece of property on 500 West zoned for 3 duplexes. The property was a typical Moab junk pile. I've cleaned it up and jumped thru the ever-changing demands of the City to get a plat approved. The City planner told me last October that if I let him work the plat thru the agencies I could get the plat approved by January. I just got it last week, 7 months late and thousands of wasted dollars later. They don't care! They don't think they are public servants. They think they are the Boss and we better do as we are told. The City engineering department is terrible, unfriendly, slow and incompetent in my opinion. I'm just trying to build six, 3 bedroom family dwellings in the medium price range that our community needs.

In Summary,

This is the first time I've taken a public stance in a Moab election. I've stayed in the background, minding my businesses. But I'm now really mad and frustrated with the Moab City government. I believe they've become too full of themselves. "building a kingdom, within a kingdom". The attitude at the City is taxpayers are too stupid to make decisions and they'll do for us what they want, when they want. The tail is wagging the DOG. We, the Sheep are being sheared, and I think it's time for a big change.

The City and County need to get together and save the millions they could with CONSOLIDATION AND COOPERATION. **We gotta take the checkbook back!**

I say **VOTE FOR CURTIS WELLS**. He's told me he'll work for and respect the taxpayers.

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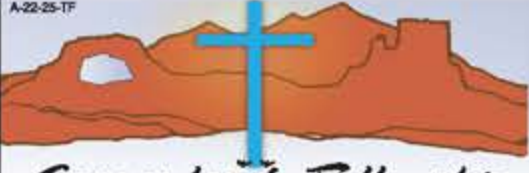

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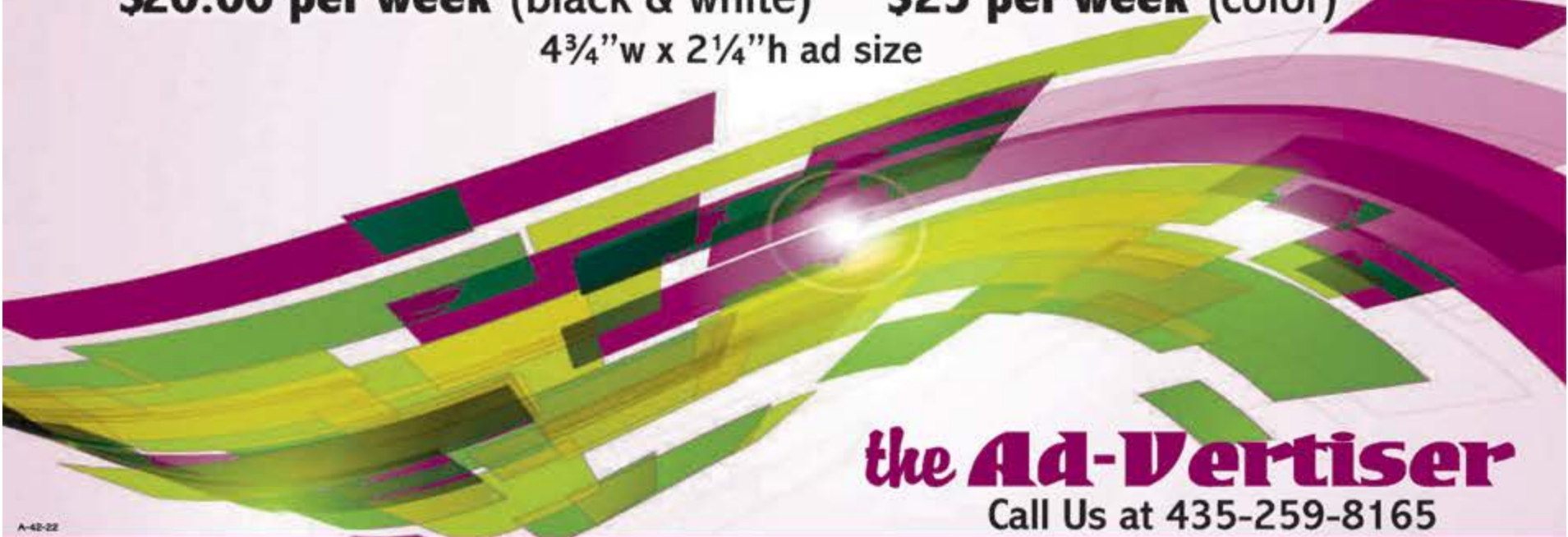
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
